[Building Partnerships with Parents](#)

Description: This video from First 3 Years explores the importance of partnerships with parents. It includes information on self-reflection as a tool to build relationships, and the four components of building a partnership.

[Developmental Surveillance and Screening: Birth through 6 Years](#)

Description: This webinar from Texas Health Steps includes information on the use of validated screening tools, how to respond to parents who have concerns about their child's development, and how to make appropriate referrals a child has, or is at risk for, a developmental delay.

[Child Development and Assessment](#)

Description: This on-line course from Texas A&M AgriLife Extension includes definitions of terms related to child development, ways to identify developmental differences that are typical and those that may be atypical,

and factors that influence development. The training also addresses how to partner with families, why play is the best way to support development, and the types of assessment methods and tools available and their appropriate uses.

Length: 4 hours

Concrete Support

Description: This course from ProSolutions Training provides a look at how providing real help to families at times when they need it most can help fortify families, minimize the stress they are experiencing, and help them take care of their children despite the circumstances they face. It includes information on what concrete support is and why it is a protective factor, how to provide welcoming, non-threatening support to families, and early warning signs of child abuse or neglect.

Routines and Environments that Support Social Emotional Development in Infants and Toddlers

Description: This course from Texas A&M AgriLife Extension presents strategies that intentionally support the social emotional development of infants and toddlers, including creating responsive routines, designing appropriate physical environments, and improving the emotional literacy of children.

Social-Emotional Screening

Description: This webinar offered by Early Childhood Investigations Webinars includes information on the purpose of social-emotional screening, identifies several social-emotional screening tools, describes how social-emotional screening tools can be administered in collaboration with families, and explains how to use screening results to plan next steps based on children's scores.
